

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION Liberty Hill Lodge #432

The Masons of this country and of Texas have long prized education. Our Founding Fathers knew that this experiment in democracy could only survive with a well-educated populace. Brother Mirabeau B. Lamar when he became the President of the Republic of Texas, had land set aside in every county for public education as well as 50 leagues of land for the state which would become the University of Texas and Texas A&M University. Many Lodges offered their buildings as the first schoolhouses for the local residents and paid the wages for principals and teachers. Thus, public education in Texas was started in the masonic lodges and we continue to support education to this day.

The purpose of the scholarship is to assist qualified students with tuition assistance to a college or university. The amount of the scholarship will be announced when awarded. A scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Liberty Hill High School. Additional scholarships may also be awarded to those with masonic affiliation.

Selection will be based on the following criteria:

- Career goals which will be enabled by higher education
- Community activities over the past few years
- Academic achievements
- School activities
- Financial need
- Employment experience

While academic achievements are important, as they show an ability to achieve your goals, they are not more important to this scholarship than your demonstrated contributions to the community and aspirations to do so in the future with the assistance of this scholarship.

Interested students are encouraged to obtain an application from the high school counselor's office or online. Each winner will be presented with a scholarship at their high school award ceremony in May.

Students must enroll in a college or university for the Fall semester directly after graduation with a minimum of 12 hours in any major to receive the scholarship, upon being selected to receive a scholarship from our lodge, it is the recipient's responsibility to provide contact information to the school finance office along with your student ID number for our use to send the scholarship funds to be put into your account to draw from as necessary. The funds will be released upon receiving confirmation of your acceptance as a student from the educational institution you have chosen.
